- 3. You are required to strictly follow the guidelines of this Department for organizing Training Programmes sponsored by DST, particularly regarding periodicity of training, age limits of participants, minimum /maximum No. of participants, restrictions on participants restrictions on participation from a particular institution/organization, restrictions on local participation etc. However, it may be noted that the maximum number of participants in a training programme has been fixed at 25.
